
USS GREGORY DD 802 Newsletter January 2014

SHIP MATES THEN AND NOW Don Gappa & Harry H. Johnsen

During the Association meeting held at the last reunion in Portland, we talked about ways to generate more interest in the Association, one way we came up with was to feature one of the members of the Association in the newsletter. I asked for anyone who would be willing to put himself out there first to let me know and send me their information about being on the Gregory and what they did after they got out of the Navy. I am happy to say that Harry Johnsen stepped forward to be the first one in the newsletter. After members read what Harry sent in I hope others will send me their information for future publications. The following is from Harry:

My name is Harry H. Johnsen. I served on the Gregory from October 1956 to July 1959 as a Seaman in First Division Deck Force and maintained the Bosen Locker my last eighteen months on the ship.

The following are some of my memories from my time on the Gregory.

In 1957, my watch station at sea was Starboard Look Out, until one night I was told to report to the Captain on the bridge. The Captain told me he had found the Helmsman asleep at the helm and the XO asleep in his chair on the port wing. So I replaced the 3rd class at the helm and he replaced me as Starboard Look out as our permanent watch stations.

In 1958, we were off the island of Quemoy, Taiwan and we had war correspondents aboard. We manned our battle stations daily for several days escorting supply boats taking cargo ashore. One boat was hit and sank and I was called to man the Starboard net and helped pull two men from the water.

In 1959, when in port, my watch was running the Liberty boat. I remember one night, going into fleet landing in San Diego, as I was pulling into the dock, the pin on the shifting lever broke when I put the boat in reverse and went under the pier. Everyone hit

the deck. Luckily no one was hurt.

I love to go to sea and wished I had stayed in the Navy, but I have no regrets.

Shortly after I left the Navy, I married my childhood sweetheart and together we had a son. From my son, I have four grandchildren and one great grandchild. I became a carpenter as a trade, worked construction, then went to work as a maintenance Carpenter for Philco-Ford. After 6 years there, I went to work for Watkins/Johnson Company. There the maintenance Department was comprised of many departments. I started in a shop called Equipment Construction Building Vacuum Systems, Special Oven and other equipment for making the products. From there, I advanced in the department, taking charge of all the shops, and advancing to Plant Engineer, I retired at the age of 59, after $33 \frac{1}{2}$ years with the company.

My wife and I divorced after 29 years. For the past 28 years, I have shared my life with my beloved Ann. These days, Ann and I travel when we can, and together have taken several cruises all over the world. I, myself have taken several trips to many countries on container ships as a passenger. I also have a sailboat, one of many over the years, and enjoy sailing the San Francisco Bay and Delta area. Also along with my brother I've motored the coast of California all the way to Cabo San Lucas, Mexico.

Again, I would like to say thanks to Harry for stepping up and letting everyone know what he has been up to in his life. It is always fun to read about what shipmates have done in their lives after the Navy. I believe it's short stories like Harry's that bring us all back together, like we were when we were shipmates aboard the Gregory. I know for my wife and I, it has been a pleasure to keep in contact with the "Old" Radar gang from my time on the Gregory. It's been well over 50+ years and we all still enjoy our get togethers. Now I just need another shipmate to step forward and send me something to put in the next newsletter.

We just received information that Plank Owner Bill Bletso has serious health issues and is in hospice at his home. Thoughts and prayers for Bill and his wife Martha at this time.
